- I study digital technologies as forms of social resistance and endurance. My current research is on the social and political impacts of information and communication technologies in Indigenous communities.
- My approach is grounded in information science. My work is generally qualitative, and oriented to contribute to the advancement of theory in information science, borderland and Indigenous studies, and science, technology, and society studies.
- The work that I do—sharing knowledge with students, academics, policy-makers, and government leaders *about* information, technology and knowledge--requires an understanding of information and communication technologies; the practical functions of information institutions such as data centers, libraries, archives and museums; the critical geopolitics of indigeneity; borderlands thought; and Indigenous and Western philosophies of science.
- The end goal of my work is to contribute to the flourishing of borderlands and Indigenous peoples.
